

## Year 8 Time Worksheet



A. 1. Peter and his sister watched an action movie that was 1 hour and 30 minutes long. After the movie, they played soccer in the backyard for 2 hours. When they came in from playing soccer, it was 5:45 P.M. What time did Peter and his sister start watching the movie?

Include *A.M.* or *P.M.* in your answer (for example, *11:58 A.M.*).

2. Vincent starting playing video games as soon as he got home from school. He played video games for 1 hour. Then Vincent helped clean the kitchen for 30 minutes. After the kitchen was clean, it took Vincent 15 minutes to finish his homework. When Vincent finished his homework, it was 3:45 P.M. What time did Vincent get home from school?

Include *A.M.* or *P.M.* in your answer (for example, *11:58 A.M.*).

3. Whitney's soccer practice started at 9:15 A.M. on Saturday morning. The team practiced dribbling for 1 hour and practiced shooting for 30 minutes. Then they played a scrimmage game for 1 hour before practice ended. What time was it when Whitney's soccer practice ended?

Include *A.M.* or *P.M.* in your answer (for example, *11:58 A.M.*).

4. Gregory and his friends decided to have a water fight on a hot summer day. They filled a bunch of water balloons and started the fight at 3:00 P.M. The water balloons lasted for 1 hour. When all the water balloons were gone, they sprayed water with hoses for 1 hour, until Gregory's dad showed up with ice cream. What time was it when the water fight ended?

Include *A.M.* or *P.M.* in your answer (for example, *11:58 A.M.*).

5. Naomi and her brother are going to a hockey game on Saturday. The game starts at 6:30 P.M. It takes 45 minutes to drive to the hockey rink, and they want to get there 1 hour before the game starts to get good seats. What is the latest time Naomi and her friends can leave for the game?

Include *A.M.* or *P.M.* in your answer (for example, *11:58 A.M.*).

6. Zane made oatmeal cookies to take to a party. It took him 15 minutes to make the dough and 1 hour to bake all of the cookies. It was 6:30 P.M. when Zane finally took the last batch of cookies out of the oven. What time was it when Zane started making the cookies?

Include *A.M.* or *P.M.* in your answer (for example, *11:58 A.M.*).
